A Classroom code per subject, the school app for the diary and the fees, email for the events. Or a diary copied off the board before the bell, and a WhatsApp group for the rest.

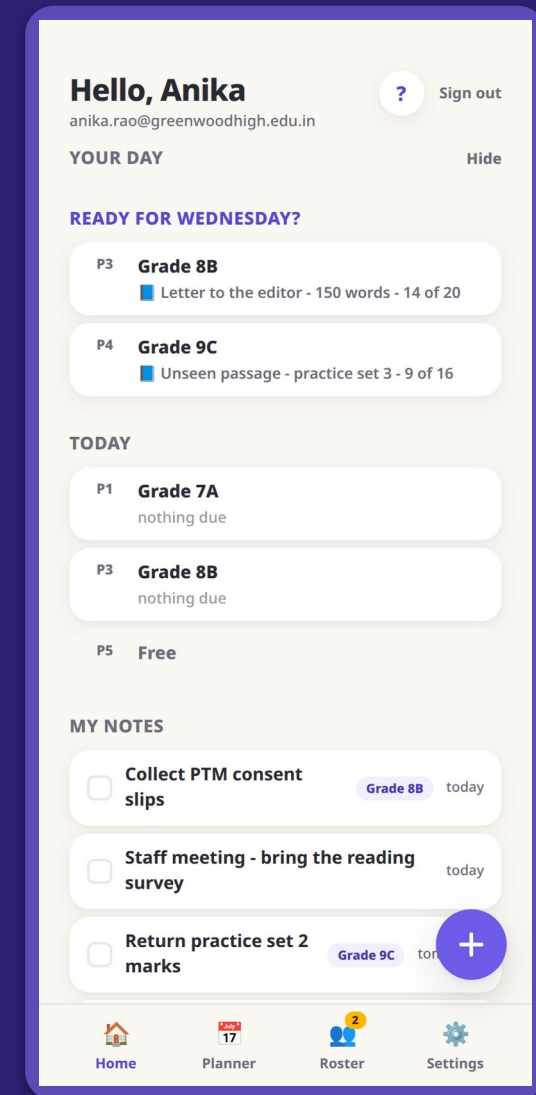
Nobody chose either arrangement. It accumulated.

IF ONE TEACHER SAYS YES

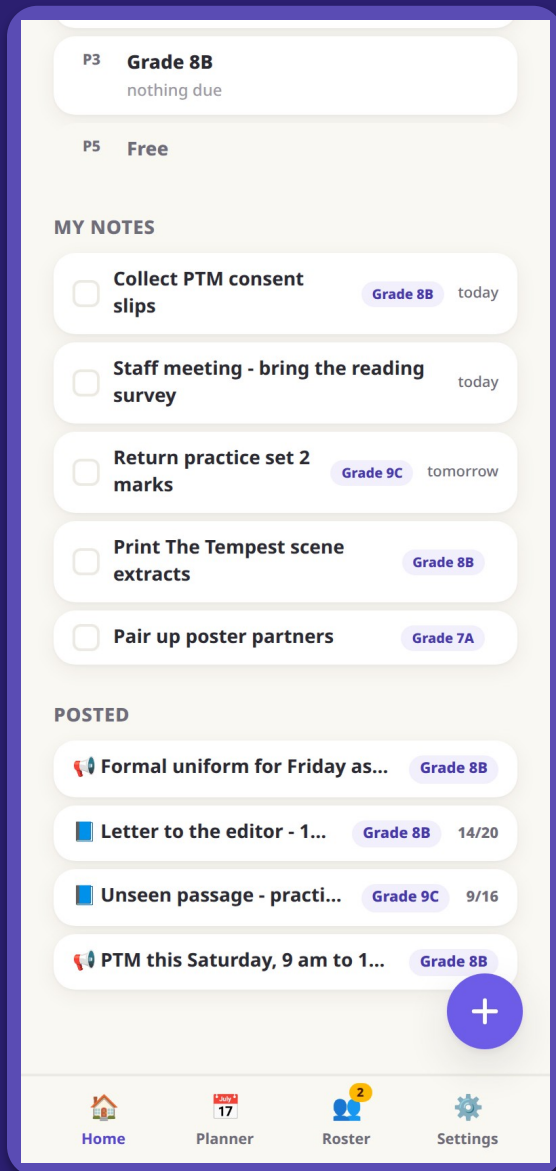
One teacher. One class. A link shared with the parents.

Nothing is installed and nothing is bought. What she gets is her own week in order: her periods, her free ones, and what is due for each class beside it.

She posts once. She sees how many finished, and never who.

Homework, an exam or a notice goes out once and arrives as a dated line in each child's own planner, beside their tuition and the rest of their week.

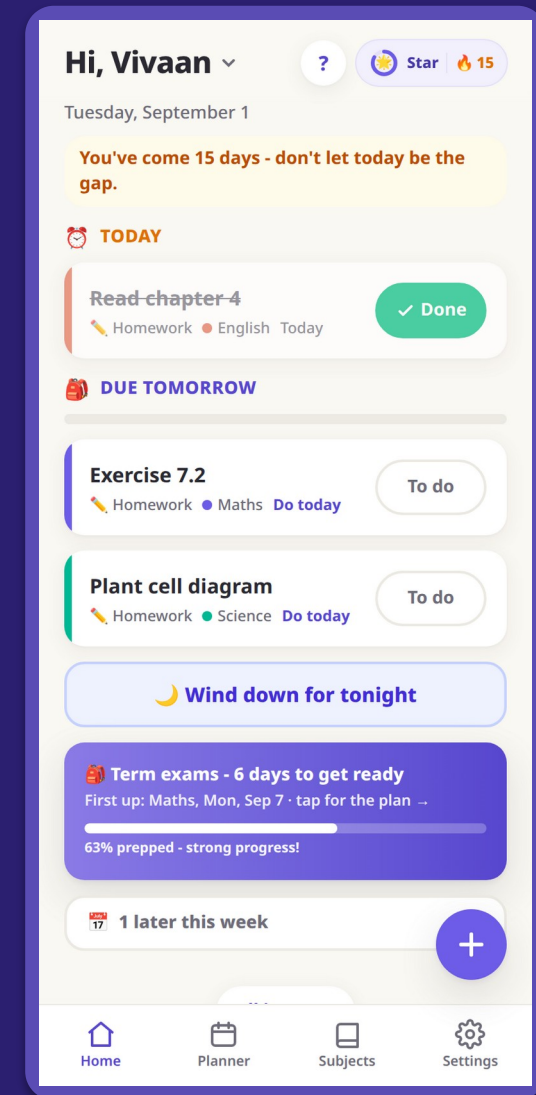
What comes back is a number. It tells her whether the class is coping before the next lesson, and thirty families never had to agree to be inspected one by one.

WHAT THE CHILD DOES WITH IT

The child opens one list, and the list is theirs.

Today first, then what is due tomorrow, with the subject beside each line. They tick a thing off and it goes quiet. Their tuition and everything else they carry sits in the same list, because it is their week and not one class's.

There is no leaderboard, and nothing a classmate can see. A child is measured against their own record, never against the class.



TUESDAY, FROM THE CHILD'S SIDE

WHAT IT ASKS OF THE SCHOOL

Nothing, to begin.

No account for your office to create. No system to connect to. No data to hand over, and no line in this term's budget. A teacher signs up the way she would for anything else she uses on a Monday morning.

To start with one class, the school's only involvement is permission. Wanting it in more classrooms than that is a conversation, and we would welcome it.

WHAT THE FAMILIES AGREE TO

The parent holds the account, and approves every link.

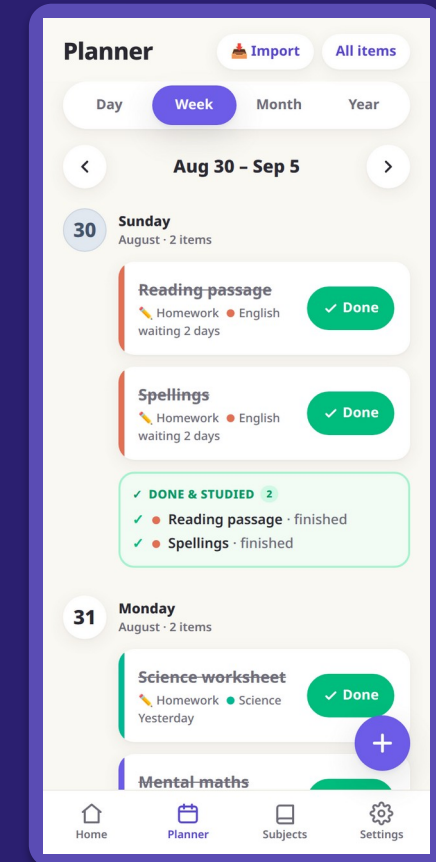
A teacher reaches a child only after the family joins her class, and she approves each joiner by name before anything is shared.

No advertising, no advertising identifiers, no profiling. Nothing is sold, and nothing is used to train anything.

Delete an account and it is kept for thirty days so a mistake can be undone, then permanently removed.

A named grievance officer, reachable by email and by phone, published on the policy.

If it did not work for that class, you have spent a term of one teacher's curiosity. The families keep their planners either way, and go on using them.

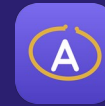
If it did work, tell us how many classes you want it in. A school can take it on for its own classrooms, and we price it by how many, in one conversation with you.
